The chapter was introduced to a little known performer on Monday, November 10. Phyllis Sands, an elementary vocal music teacher from the Wilson School District of West Lawn PA, thrilled the listeners to a varied showcase of music ranging from classical numbers such as Bach's "Tocatta and Fugue in D minor, Mussorgski's "Promenade" and Walton's "Imperial March" to a few selected hymn tunes. After a brief intermission, Ms Sands returned to play popular tunes that ranged from country western to show tunes. She included some of the following numbers: "Crazy", "Ring of Fire", "Redneck Woman", "Nola", "Alley Cat", "Edelweiss", "Baby Elephant Walk", "Wedding Processional" from the Sound of Music, "A Whiter Shade of Pale", to name a few. She even played the "Washington Post March". On some of the music that was played, the "dust was cleaned out of the pipes". Excellent!


