


**BARR-FOX WURLITZER" **PIPE DREAM" VIDEOS

MONDAY, NOVEMBER 8TH AT 7:00 PM CAPITOL THEATRE, YORK, PA



"THE BARR-FOX WURLITZER" The history of the Barr-Fox Wurlitzer Theater Organ and the story of its 5-year restoration by film composer Nathan Barr. This magnificent instrument lived on the Newman Scoring Stage at Fox from 1928 to 1997, and can be heard on countless film scores from the 20th century, including The Sound of Music, Patton, Home Alone, and The Day the Earth Stood Still. Since Nathan restored the instrument, it has re-entered the world of contemporary film music, heard in films and television programs such as The Grinch (2018), The House With a Clock in Its Walls (2018), The Addams Family (2019), Carnival Row (2019), and Uncle Frank (2020).

"PIPE DREAM" The 1924 Kimball pipe organ located in Elkhart, Indiana's Lerner Theatre is one of only three Kimball pipe organs currently installed in its original location. The organ was restored following the 2011 renovation of the theatre which opened on Thanksgiving Day, 1924. Once again playing beautiful music, the restored organ is a jewel. In this video you will not only see and hear the organ being played but you will follow the restoration process from an unplayable, water damaged organ to the beautiful instrument that it is today. You will meet the people who were involved in the restoration process and peek over their shoulders as they resurrect the organ using their artistic abilities. This story is one that you will find surprisingly compelling!

The effort to attract an audience with free admission for Nathan Avakian was of limited success (about 35 were in attendance), but those that attended were most appreciative of his program. I did the "baby siting" for Nathan's setup efforts. He treated every arrangement with the same and thorough effort to select the best stops and carefully blend them with a unique sound pallet for each number. Since Terry Nace had done a wonderful tuning effort just before, the off-tremulant sounds were as good as all the others.

Our Leadership Committee meeting prior to Nathan's program reviewed the year's plans with particular focus on what options exist for a December program, considering we will probably not visit the Masonic Village this year. For December the Capitol Theatre will have a "White Christmas" film weekend December 11-12, with our second Monday date of December 13th. I'd like to hear about your preferences for a December meeting. First Monday, Second Monday or some other program option? Anyone wishing to prepare a 10-minute program for video on our Facebook page, please let me know.

Our Chapter meeting on November 8th will be a video presentation. We have a short 12-minute video that Nathan Barr has published on his studio Wurlitzer and its use for film music scoring. Following will be a video that details the project to restore the Elkhart, IN, Lerner Theatre's Kimball theatre organ. The instrument had been heavily damaged by water and plaster and the project reviews the restoration efforts.


