



**Greetings from Providence**

As I write this I am seated in my hotel room in Providence, RI, where, together with half a dozen others from SVTOS, I am attending the ATOS National Conference. And what an affair it is and has been. We've heard some wonderful theatre pipe organs played by the best in the business.



Some folks arrived a day early for a "Prelude" that included concerts at three different homes. The official opening concert was by Ron Rhode on the newly installed 4/35 Wurlitzer in the Hanover Theatre in Worcester, MA. In all, the five day conference includes some 10 artists on six different instruments including a full-length silent film--all this along with a general membership meeting and several seminars and workshops. I'm also hoping to pick up a few new CDs at the "Record Shop" and chat with some other chapter presidents.

While next year's conference will be on the west coast, the 2013 event will be in Atlanta. If you really like theatre organ music, then you should seriously consider attending an ATOS national conference. And if you're not a member, it's a great reason to join!!

Even though we are in Providence, work continues on our October open-to-the-public concert. We've raised over \$2,500 in sponsorships and donations toward our goal of \$3,000. Letters have gone out to nearly 150 retirement communities and senior living facilities inviting them to spread the word and bring a group. 
