A Silent Film Festival

3 Sets of Movies with 3 Accompanists
Saturday April 15th 10AM - 5PM
The Colonial Theatre, 227 Bridge Street, Phoenixville, PA

The Silent Film Festival covers 3 segments: Comedy, Drama, and Adventure, in that order. Each segment should run approximately 2 hours beginning at 10:00 AM, with intermissions between the major groups.

Ticket prices are \$15.00 per film for people over 16, or \$35.00 for all three films for the binge watchers. People under 16 can see each film for \$5.00 for each movie.

The comedy portion (10:00 AM) will be presented in collaboration with both the Philadelphia and Downingtown Chapters of the *Sons of Desert*, the official fan club of Laurel & Hardy film enthusiasts. Four Laurel & Hardy silent short films will be featured: "Two Tars" "The Second Hundred Years," "Slipping Wives" and "From Soup to Nuts" accompanied by *Wayne Zimmerman*.

The drama portion (1:00 PM) will have Cecil B. DeMille's epic "King of Kings," accompanied by Glenn Hough.

The adventure portion (approx. **3:30 PM**) will be "**The Mark of Zorro,**" starring Douglas Fairbanks, accompanied by **Don Kinnier**. Remarkably then and now, Fairbanks performed his own stunts.
