VIDEO - "STAN KANN: THE HAPPIEST MAN IN THE WORLD"

MONDAY MARCH 13TH, 7:00 PM CAPITOL THEATRE, YORK, PA



An intimate portrait of Theater Organist/ Entertainer/ Vacuum Cleaner Aficionado, **Stan Kann**, the film chronicles Kann's lengthy career and his lifelong obsessions with music and collecting. From roller rink musician to silent film accompanist, to Movie Palace gadabout, Kann lived a charmed life of hobby and enthusiasm. An unmatched success as a network television personality - appearing as the self-styled Guru of Gadgets 77 times on The Tonight Show with Johnny Carson, 89 times on The Mike Douglas Show,

and countless other appearances

through the 1970s & 80s - Kann's gregarious personality and his improvisational skills made him a household name. Utilizing interviews with Kann, archival footage of his television appearances and contemporary footage of Stan in action, the film celebrates all that was Kann, from his talent to his quirky personal interests (cars, music, and a peculiar collection of 135 antique vacuums!).

Concerts take place each Sunday at 4:00 p.m. on the IV/83 J. Nedra Schilling Organ/Orgues Létourneau Opus 136.

On March 5, Rhonda Sider Edgington, director of music and organist at Hope Church in Holland, Michigan, will play. A native of central Pennsylvania, she teaches organ at Calvin University in Grand Rapids and performs regularly across the United States, both as a soloist and as part of the Great Lakes Duo (organ and trumpet) and Thunder & Wind (organ and percussion).

On March 12, Tyler A. Canonico, minister of music and organist at the host church and sub-dean of the Harrisburg Chapter AGO, will perform. A graduate of the University of Alabama, he is organist for the Harrisburg Symphony Orchestra and music instructor and director of the College Choir at Lebanon Valley College, Annville, Pennsylvania.

On March 19, Peter Yardley-Jones, a graduate of the University of Glasgow and organist of the Swiss Church, Covent Garden, London, will play. Yardley-Jones has performed solo recitals at many of the UK's most prestigious venues, including St. John's College, Cambridge, and has made several concert tours in the United States.

On March 26, the final performer in the series will be Dr. Isabelle Demers, born in Québec and a graduate of The Juilliard School. Dr. Demers is the newly-appointed associate professor of organ at McGill University in Montréal and an internationally-known recitalist, having appeared throughout Europe, Oman, Australia, New Zealand, the United States, and Canada.
