MICHAEL CARTER Showcase

MONDAY SEPTEMBER 16TH, 7:00 PM NOTE: MEETING IS ON THE THIRD MONDAY CAPITOL THEATRE, YORK, PA

MICHAEL CARTER hails from the ancient town of Warwick, in the centre of England. At the age of nine, he heard the 3/14 Blackpool Tower Wurlitzer during a family holiday and was mesmerised by the magical sound. He immediately decided he wanted to play that organ! After six years of lessons, mostly with the last of the pre-WWII cinema organists, Foley Bates, Michael achieved his ambition when one of the tower team of organists made it possible.

During his school years, Michael worked in local music shops, demonstrating and selling organs. He also started playing for local events on Hammond, and later, a Yamaha with MIDI expanders.

Michael joined the Cinema Organ Society and became the booking secretary for the Midlands & Wales District. It was as a member of the COS that Michael was awarded a scholarship to attend his first theatre organ summer workshop.

For many years, Michael joined his tutor Foley, and pianist Stanley Smith – billed as 'The Midlands Trio' – for an annual concert on the COS ex-Tower Cinema, West Bromwich, 3/10 Compton organ. Here he introduced his electronic organ skills alongside the theatre organ in a cross-over presentation designed to complement pipes with rhythms and additional sounds. (Continued on Page 3).



By 21, Michael was playing concerts on electronic and cameo appearances on theatre organ, but life and his career in IT started to take over and it was time for music to take a back seat.

Roll forward 20 years to 2012 and Michael started to play at home again, purchased a newer Yamaha, linked it with Hauptwerk and began to revive old arrangements and create brand new ones.

In 2015, Michael attended his first ATOS convention in Philadelphia and his passion for theatre organ was re-ignited. He joined a team of organists at The Cannock Chase Organ Club putting on informal bi-weekly presentations on the 3/6 ex-Douglas Isle-of-Man Compton.

The following year, at very short notice, Michael was invited to play the second half of a concert introducing young artists on the 3/7 Clayhall Compton. On the day, sickness and other reasons meant that Declan Poole was the only youngster to play the first half. To fill the space, other organists present on the day took to the bench, these were Bernard Tilley, Simon Gledhill and David Gray... no pressure then!

After this re-baptism of fire, Michael started to take both theatre and electronic bookings around the country, including the now-removed, Shrewsbury Buttermarket Wurlitzer, the Beer Wurlitzer,

House, The COS Saltaire Wurlitzer, Stockport
Town Hall, The COS Fentham Hall Compton, a
Live-Stream from The Musical Museum at
Kew Bridge during Covid and a special event
on the Troxy Wurlitzer. Michael has also
played two weekend tours for the
Netherlands Organ Federation, with a third
being planned.

In 2017, Michael became Assistant Editor of Cinema Organ, the journal of the COS – taking

over as Editor soon after – a voluntary role he continues today. In addition to editing the entire text, Michael also uses his IT and artistic skills to typeset and design the whole publication.

In recent years, Michael has extended his stays whilst attending ATOS conventions, and made additional trips to visit the USA, to play many of the fabulous theatre organ installations whilst meeting owners, other enthusiasts, and making great friends along the way.
